May 8, Wednesday: Last day to submit a request for cancellation/withdrawal from all courses with no tuition charges. (Students must contact the Counseling program to drop their class).

May 9, Thursday: Last day to enroll, add a course, or drop a course without academic record (<u>tuition charges apply</u>). Last day to withdraw from the term without academic record (<u>withdrawal refund schedule applies</u>).

May 13, Monday: First Day of Class.

May 16, Thursday: Last day to drop a course (grade of W) and withdraw from the University (grades of W). (Students must contact the Counseling program to drop their class).

May 17, Friday: Last day of classes, including examinations.

May 27, Monday: Memorial Day. University offices closed.

May 28, Tuesday: Official close of term and conferral of degrees.

Summer Term 2024

June 3 - August 6, 2024 Registration: April 1 - April 19, 2024

The summer term consists of four primary sessions: Dallas Full Session, Dallas First Session (June), and Dallas Second Session (July). Each primary session has different deadline dates. The Counseling program offers a limited number of selected courses during the Summer Term, June 3 – August 6, with unique start, end, deadline dates, and class meeting times to accommodate the particular needs of the course.

Dallas First Session (June)

Registration: April 1 - April 19, 2024

Classes meet 4 hours, 15 minutes once a week; or in the two-weekend format, Friday from 4:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., Saturday and Sunday from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

June 2, Sunday: Last day to submit a request for cancellation/withdrawal from all courses with no tuition charges. (Students must contact the Counseling program to drop their class).

June 3, Monday: First day of classes.

June 4, Tuesday: Last day to enroll, add courses or drop courses without academic record (tuition charges apply). Last day to withdraw from the session without academic record

M.S. in Counseling requirements

The Counseling Program is open to persons holding a bachelor's or higher professional degree from an accredited university or college. A completed admissions application and all official academic transcripts from all institutions of higher education are required. University Financial Policies

A Counseling student who is financially indebted to the University will not be awarded a diploma or transcript until all financial obligations have been met. Penalty fees are assessed for dishonored checks (\$30) and late payments (\$150). Tuition charges and fees, as well as the tuition deadlines for each term are listed on the Bursar's webpage listed above. Application fees are nonrefundable as is the credit card surcharge of 2.75%. Tuition refunds for Add/Drops and Withdrawals are described above.

Students using Financial Aid should consult their <u>Financial Aid representative</u> prior to dropping a course.

Incompletes

Students who have been granted grades of Incomplete by their instructor must complete the coursework within one calendar year from the date of the original class. Incompletes left open after that time may become a grade of 'F'. A maximum of two (6 hours) concurrently held grades of Incomplete is allowed. Students who accumulate a total of three grades of incomplete will be put on probation and not allowed to enroll further until the total is reduced. A student cannot graduate with any grade of Incomplete.

Academic Regulations
